EAPCET-2022 Admissions

Public notice

All the candidates are informed that minimum marks in the qualifying examination i.e. Intermediate/equivalent for admissions into professional UG courses in Engineering& Pharma-D courses has been relaxed as one time measure for the academic year 2022-2023 as per the orders received from Government vide Lr.No.1826105/EC/2022 of Higher Education(EC) Department dated:01.09.2022.

Further, the candidates are informed that the existing rule is modified as per the above Government Orders as detailed below.

Existing Admission Rule:

"Candidates should have passed qualifying exam (10+2) conducted by Board of Intermediate Education, A.P. or its equivalent and obtained at least 45% marks (40 % in case of candidates belonging to reserved categories) in prescribed group subjects.

Explanation:

In above rule, only group (Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry) subjects in the intermediate (both $1^{\rm st}$ year and $2^{\rm nd}$ year)/equivalent have been taken into account for calculation of the % of marks. The total marks of all the subjects in the intermediate (both $1^{\rm st}$ year and $2^{\rm nd}$ year) have not been considered for calculation of the % of marks. So, as per the existing rule, students who have obtained 45% marks (40 % in case of candidates belonging to reserved categories) in group (Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry) subjects in the intermediate (both $1^{\rm st}$ year and $2^{\rm nd}$ year)/equivalent and obtained rank EAPCET-2022 are eligible for EAMCET/EAPCET admissions.

Modified Admission Rule:

"Candidates should have passed qualifying exam (10+2) conducted by Board of Intermediate Education, A.P. or its equivalent and obtained at least 45% marks (40 % in case of candidates belonging to reserved

categories) in prescribed group subjects/aggregate marks both in 1st& 2nd year examinations of intermediate (or)2nd year intermediate examination alone and shall have secured a rank in EAPCET-2022."

Explanation:

In above modified rule, group (Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry) subjects in the intermediate (both 1st year and 2nd year)/equivalent **or** the total marks of all the subjects in the intermediate (both 1st year and 2nd year) have been considered for calculation of the % of marks. The students who have obtained 45% marks (40 % in case of candidates belonging to reserved categories) in group subjects (Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry) subjects **or** the total marks of all the subjects in the intermediate (both 1st year and 2nd year) in the intermediate (both 1st year and 2nd year) /equivalent and obtained rank EAPCET-2022 are eligible for EAMCET/EAPCET admissions.

or

The marks in the group (Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry) subjects **only in the 2**nd **year** intermediate/equivalent **or** the total marks of all the subjects in the **2**nd **year** intermediate **only have been considered for calculation of the % of marks.** The 1st year intermediate/equivalent marks will be not be considered. So the students who have obtained 45% marks (40 % in case of candidates belonging to reserved categories) in group subjects (Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry) subjects **in the 2**nd **year** intermediate/equivalent **or** the total marks of all the subjects in the **2**nd **year** intermediate and obtained rank EAPCET-2022 are eligible for EAMCET/EAPCET admissions.

Hence, the students who have obtained the marks less than 45% (40 % in case of candidates belonging to reserved categories) in prescribed group subjects, whose certificates are auto verified/ verified at HLCs through online and whose candidature is rejected earlier, and secured marks as per the above Government orders are directed to approach nearest Help Line Centre for verification of Certificates for getting eligibility.
